

DUTY OF CARE

CBAA 2022 will be held compliant with current health regulations as laid out by the Federal Government of Canada, Province of Ontario, Peel Region, Greater Toronto Airport Authority and the Host Venues.

Participants must comply with all set procedures to reduce the spread of COVID-19 while attending the CBAA 2022 Conference, and must attest only to attend if:

- participant is not experiencing any symptoms of illness such as cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, or new loss of taste or
- participant does not believe to have been exposed to someone with a suspected and/or confirmed case of the COVID-19.
- participant has not been diagnosed with COVID-19, or has been cleared as non-contagious by the province or local public health
- participant is following all Public Health mandates from all regulatory bodies as much as possible and limiting potential exposure to COVID-19.

CONFERENCE VENUES:

Marriott Hotel, Woodbine Golf Club & SPiN Toronto currently have no restrictions in place. Mask/face coverings are strongly recommended.

SKYSERVICE FBO:

All event participants (exhibit staff, attendees, service provider suppliers and event staff) will be registered and provided with a badge to identify them as part of the event.

- **Health & Vaccine Check:** On initial entry to the facility, all participants must show proof of vaccine status to facility security and be screened for symptoms.
- **Mandatory Masking:** Face Coverings **must be worn** by all employees and participants while on airport property as per the current Toronto Pearson Directive.
- **Sanitizer Stations:** Hand sanitizers will be available at the registration desk, and in high-traffic areas of the event.

Cleaning Protocols:

All high-touch areas including catering and eating tables, washrooms, etc. will be consistently cleaned throughout the event.

Procedure in the event of any confirmed COVID-19 cases or outbreaks:

1. If someone becomes ill, the individual will immediately be isolated and building/security personnel will be notified to ensure protocols for reporting and care are provided.
2. Remove from site – call 416-776-3033 if an emergency.
3. The Activity Permit Holder must immediately notify the GTAA of any confirmed COVID-19 cases or outbreaks at your facility or event. This notification shall be done in accordance with privacy laws, without including the names or any personal identifying information of the persons who have tested positive for COVID-19.
