The Year In Review

No matter the challenges of the past year, the CBAA stayed focussed on what its members needed to endure the challenges of COVID while preparing for the future. In 2021, CBAA acted on behalf of its industry by:

Lobbying government to:

Remove unnecessary COVID air travel restrictions

- Implement standardized, fair and simple vaccine policies
- Remove testing requirements for fully vaccinated passengers
- Reopen all Airports of Entry to international flights
- Resolve service issues at CBSA and PHAC

Remove or rethink luxury tax on aircraft

- At a minimum, delay implementation to January 2023
- If the date of implementation is not delayed, ensure that aircraft with a confirmed bill of sale prior to January 2022 are not subject to luxury tax

Restrict applicability to recreational aircraft only, excluding any aircraft used for business

Increase valuation to \$5 million

Support our carbon reduction efforts

- Provide incentives to encourage the production and use of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF)
- Reduce the use of fossil fuels by providing incentives to purchase new aircraft or upgrade avionics and materials

Support the future of aerospace in Canada

- Make a portion of the R&D investment tax credit refundable to aerospace
- Allow corporations to renounce R&D expenditures to flow-through share investors

Increasing member value by:

- Creating the CBAA Slack channel to allow operator members to share best practices, identify critical challenges and deal with government decisions
- Holding monthly Check Thrust Thursdays to connect operators with subject matter experts and CBAA staff to hear about issues and resolve questions
- Continuing the availability of MEL and Type
 Rating exemptions to help speed up regulatory
 approvals and simplify compliance
- Helping sellers connect with buyers with the 2021 online Buyers Guide
- Creating new online/digital marketplaces and sponsorship opportunities
- ▶ Strengthening the Industry Partnership Program to help connect associates with our operators during these challenging economic conditions
